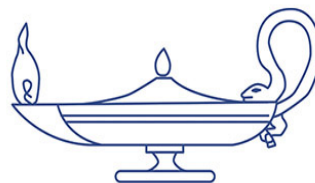

As the first publication of its kind, the Yearbook has served as a pivotal forum for international law scholarship in Asia for three decades. This landmark volume will reflect on the most significant developments in the field during this period.

We invite scholars and practitioners to submit papers that answer the following question:

What do you consider to be the three most important international law issues of the past 30 years (1995-2025)?

Each submission should address this question from three distinct perspectives:

1. **A Global Perspective:** Identify and analyze an international law issue of global significance.
2. **A Regional Perspective (Asia):** Examine an international law issue that has had a profound impact on the Asian region.
3. **Your Own Country's Perspective:** Discuss an international law issue that has been particularly important to your home country.

For each of the three issues, please provide a concise analysis of **500 words or less** (for a total submission of 1,500 words). Submissions should clearly articulate the rationale behind your choices, explaining why these issues are so important.

Submission Guidelines

- **Topic:** The three most important international law issues of the past 30 years (1995-2025).
- **Word Count:** Maximum 1,500 words in total, with each of the three sections limited to 500 words.
- **Submission Format:** Papers should be submitted as a single document.
- **Deadline for Submissions:** December 31, 2025
- **Submission Email:** All papers should be submitted to Professor Seokwoo Lee at leeseokwoo@inha.ac.kr.
